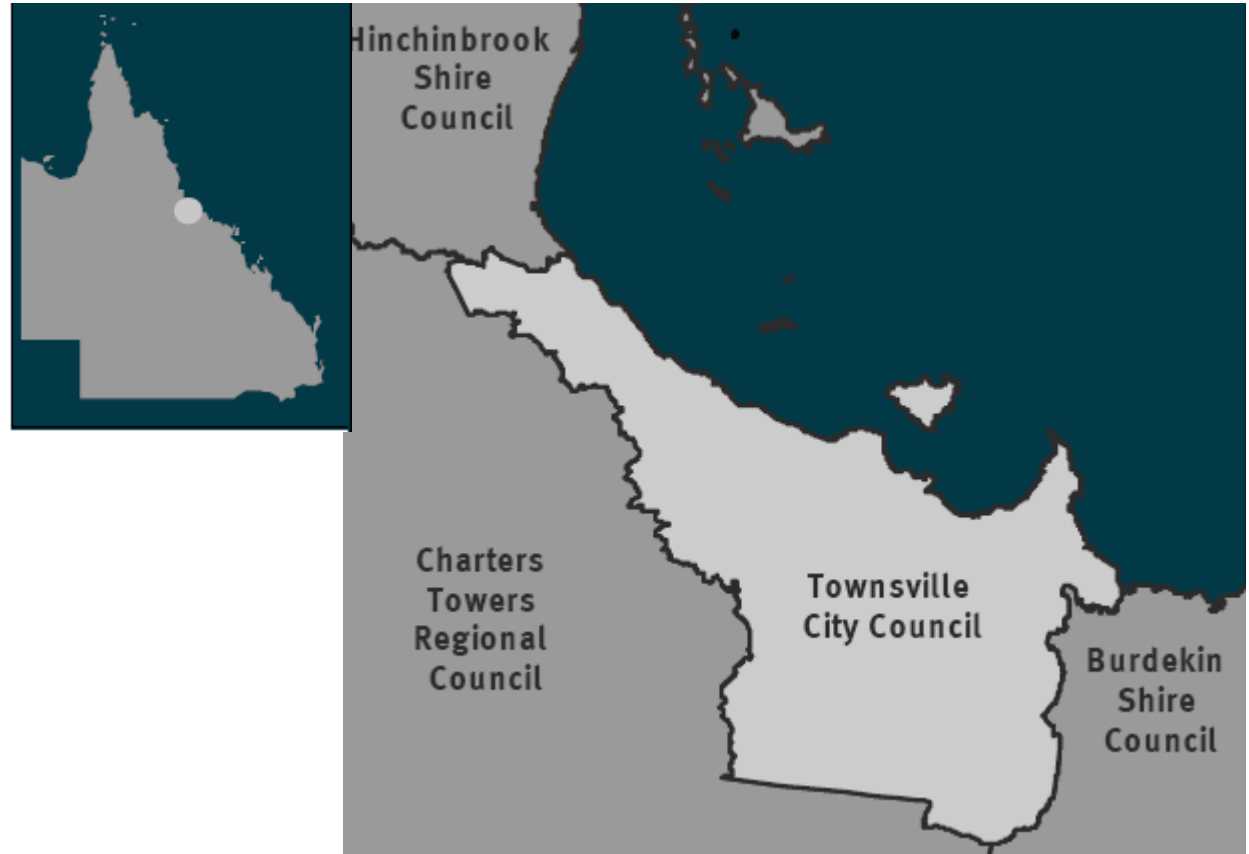

AREA

Townsville City covers an area of 3,736 km² which represents 0.2 per cent of the total area of the State (1,734,190 km²).



POPULATION

As at 30 June 2008, the estimated resident population for the Townsville Local Government Area was 175,542 people, an increase of 5,134 people or 3% over the year.

This compares with an increase of 5130 people or 3.1% for the year to 30 June 2007.

Estimated Resident Population (ERP) is derived from census usual residence counts, by making three adjustments: (a) an adjustment for people in Australia at the time of the Census who were not counted; (b) inclusion of an estimated number of Australian residents who were temporarily overseas on Census night, and (c) an adjustment for births, deaths and migration between 30 June and the Census date (8 August 2006).

FUTURE TRENDS

Projections published by the Department of Local Government and Planning in 2006 indicate that the population of the new Townsville City will increase from 144,789 in 2001 to 220,136 in 2026.

The annual average growth rate between 2001 and 2026 in the new Townsville City is projected to be 1.7 per cent. This compares with an annual average growth rate of 1.7 per cent for the State. As a result, Townsville's share of Queensland's population is projected to be 3.9 per cent in 2026 compared with 4.0 per cent in 2001.

PEOPLE AGE BY SEX

In the 2006 Census (held on August 8 2006), 21.7% of people, usually resident in Townsville City, were children aged between 0 to 14 years, compared with Queensland where 20.7%, were aged 0 to 14 years. For Townsville City 18.9% of people were aged 55 years and over, compared with Queensland where 23.6 %, were aged 55 years and above.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER PEOPLE

At the time of the 2006 Census, there were 8,526 Townsville City residents who stated that they were Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people. Townsville's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people comprised 5.5 per cent of the total population (compared with 3.3 per cent for Queensland).

Of the 8,526 people who stated that they were of Indigenous origin, 6,054 people stated that they were of Aboriginal origin, 1,516 people stated that they were of Torres Strait Islander origin, and 956 people stated that they were of both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander origin.

SELECTED MEDIANS

The following data is from the 2006 Census of Population and Housing.

Townsville City, with a median age of 33 years, has a younger population profile than that of Queensland.

For Townsville, there is a larger proportion of the population aged under 15 and a smaller proportion aged over 65.

Median household income is \$67 a week higher in Townsville City, than for Queensland.

The proportion of Townsville people living with a severe or profound disability is 3.5% compared with 4.0% of the Queensland population.

TOWNSVILLE FAMILY COMPOSITION

Despite an increase of 2,656 in the number of people in families with children, the proportion of people in 'couples without children' increased from 23.1% to 24.8% over the five years to 2006.

EMPLOYMENT CHARACTERISTICS

During the week prior to the 2006 Census, 79,850 people aged 15 years and over, who were usually resident in the new Townsville City, were in the labour force. Of these 64% were employed fulltime, 24.8% were employed part-time, 6.61% were employed but away from work and 4.4% were unemployed.

There were 33,326 usual residents aged 15 years and over who were not in the labour force.

BUILDING APPROVALS

In the year ended December 2008, there were 1,845 residential dwelling unit approvals in Townsville City Council. These approvals were valued at \$553.0 million and represented 5.2 per cent of the overall total for the State.

The value of non-residential building approvals in Townsville City Council in the year ended December 2008 was \$332.9 million. This represented 3.9 per cent of the value of these approvals in Queensland.

SCHOOL STUDENTS

For students attending a school in the new Townsville City, 64.9 per cent attended government schools and 35.1 per cent attended non-government schools in the year 2006. The corresponding percentages for Queensland were 69.9 per cent of school students attended government schools and 30.1 per cent attended non-government schools.

There were 11,057 students attending a government primary school (years 1 to 7) in the new Townsville City area and 5,199 students attending a non-government primary school. In secondary school (years 8 to 12) there were 6,626 government students and 4,664 non-government students.

MEAN TAXABLE INCOME OF TAXPAYERS

Statistics from the Australian Taxation Office show that the mean taxable income of taxpayers in the new Townsville City for the 2004-05 financial year was \$43,055. This figure was \$961 more than the equivalent Queensland figure (\$42,094).

CORE ACTIVITY NEED FOR ASSISTANCE

The 'Core Activity Need for Assistance' variable has been developed to measure the number of people with a profound or severe disability. People with a profound or severe disability are defined as needing help or assistance in one or more of the three core activity areas of self-care, mobility and communication because of a disability, long term health condition (lasting six months or more), or old age.
