

# Service age groups

The Age Structure of City of Townsville provides key insights into the level of demand for age based services and facilities such as child care. It is an indicator of City of Townsville's residential role and function and how it is likely to change in the future.

Service age groups divide the population into age categories that reflect typical life-stages. They indicate the level of demand for services that target people at different stages in life and how that demand is changing.

To get a more complete picture City of Townsville's Age Structure should be viewed in conjunction with Household Types and Dwelling Types.



#### Age structure - service age groups, 2021



## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the service age groups of City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a higher proportion of people in the younger age groups (0 to 17 years) and a lower proportion of people in the older age groups (60+ years).

Overall, 23.1% of the population was aged between 0 and 17, and 19.9% were aged 60 years and over, compared with 22.4% and 22.8% respectively for Queensland.

#### The major differences between the age structure of City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A larger percentage of 'Tertiary education & independence' (10.6% compared to 8.6%)
- A *larger* percentage of 'Young workforce' (14.5% compared to 13.6%)
- A smaller percentage of 'Seniors' (8.2% compared to 10.0%)

#### **Emerging groups**

From 2016 to 2021, City of Townsville's population increased by 6,020 people (3.2%). This represents an average annual population change of 0.64% per year over the period.

#### The largest changes in the age structure in this area between 2016 and 2021 were in the age groups:

- Seniors (70 to 84) (+3,802 people)
- Empty nesters and retirees (60 to 69) (+2,425 people)
- Babies and pre-schoolers (0 to 4) (-1,439 people)
- Tertiary education and independence (18 to 24) (-1,093 people)

# **Birthplace**

Country of Birth data identifies where people were born and is indicative of the level of cultural diversity in City of Townsville. The mix of Country of Birth groups is also indicative of historical settlement patterns, as source countries for Australia's immigration program have varied significantly over time.

To get a more complete picture of cultural and ethnic characteristics, City of Townsville's Country of Birth data should be viewed together with Ancestry, Language Spoken at Home and Religion.

Please note: Due to changes in ABS rules around perturbation and additivity of data to protect the confidentiality of individuals, counts of individual birthplace groups and totals derived from them may differ slightly from those published by the ABS. 


#### Birthplace, 2021

## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the country of birth of the population in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a smaller proportion of people born overseas.

Overall, 14.0% of the population was born overseas, compared with 22.7% for Queensland.

The largest non-English speaking country of birth in City of Townsville was Philippines, where 1.1% of the population, or 2,052 people, were born.

The major differences between the countries of birth of the population in City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A *smaller* percentage of people born in New Zealand (2.1% compared to 4.0%)
- A *smaller* percentage of people born in United Kingdom (3.0% compared to 4.4%)

# **Emerging groups**

Between 2016 and 2021, the number of people born overseas increased by 1559 or 6.1%.

The largest changes in birthplace countries of the population in this area between 2016 and 2021 were for those born in:

- India (+429 persons)
- Philippines (+389 persons)
- New Zealand (-176 persons)
- South Korea (+109 persons)

# Language used at home

City of Townsville's language statistics show the proportion of the population who use a language at home other than English. They indicate how culturally diverse a population is and the degree to which different ethnic groups and nationalities are retaining their language.

City of Townsville's language statistics should be analysed in conjunction with Country of Birth and Proficiency in English to assist in identifying specific cultural and ethnic groups in the area and the services required by the multicultural community.




#### Language used at home, 2021

## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the language used at home by the population of City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a larger proportion of people who used English only, and a smaller proportion of those using a non-English language (either exclusively, or in addition to English).

Overall, 83.9% of the population used English only, and 7.9% used a non-English language, compared with 80.5% and 13.2% respectively for Queensland.

The dominant language used at home, other than English, in City of Townsville was Filipino/Tagalog, with 0.8% of the population, or 1,502 people using this language at home.

The major difference between the languages used at home for the population of City of Townsville and Queensland in 2021 was:

• A *smaller* percentage using Mandarin at home (0.3% compared to 1.6%)

# **Emerging groups**

Between 2016 and 2021, the number of people who used a language other than English at home increased by 1,908 or 14.3%, and the number of people who used English only increased by 2,697 or 1.7%.

The largest changes in the languages used by the population in City of Townsville between 2016 and 2021 were for those using:

- Australian Indigenous Languages (+329 persons)
- Swahili (+285 persons)
- Malayalam (+236 persons)
- Filipino/Tagalog (+216 persons)

# Religion

City of Townsville's religion statistics provide an indicator of cultural identity and ethnicity when observed in conjunction with other key variables. Religion data reveal the major concentrations of religions as well as revealing the proportion of people with no religious affiliation. There are a number of reasons for different religious compositions across areas including the country of birth and ethnic background of the population, the age of the population (belief in religion is generally stronger, the older the population) and changes in values and belief systems.

City of Townsville's religion statistics should be analysed in conjunction with other ethnicity statistics such as Country of Birth data and Language Spoken data to assist in identifying specific cultural and ethnic groups.

Please note: Due to changes in ABS rules around perturbation and additivity of data to protect the confidentiality of individuals, counts of individual religion groups and totals derived from them may differ slightly from those published by the ABS.




#### Religion, 2021

## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the religious affiliation of the population of City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a lower proportion of people who professed a religion as well as a lower proportion who stated they had no religion.

Overall, 50.1% of the population nominated a religion, and 40.2% said they had no religion, compared with 50.7% and 41.0% respectively for Queensland.

The largest single religion in City of Townsville was Western (Roman) Catholic, with 22.5% of the population or 43,301 people as adherents.

The major difference between the religious affiliation for the population of City of Townsville and Queensland was:

• A larger percentage who nominated Western (Roman) Catholic (22.5% compared to 18.6%)

## **Emerging groups**

The largest changes in the religious affiliation of the population in City of Townsville between 2016 and 2021 were for those who nominated:

- Anglican (-6,720 persons)
- Western (Roman) Catholic (-6,025 persons)
- Uniting Church (-2,513 persons)
- Presbyterian and Reformed (-1,575 persons)

# Qualifications

Educational Qualifications relate to education outside of primary and secondary school and are one of the most important indicators of socio-economic status. With other data sources, such as **Employment Status**, **Income** and **Occupation**, City of Townsville's Educational Qualifications help to evaluate the economic opportunities and socio-economic status of the area and identify skill gaps in the labour market.




#### Highest qualification achieved, 2021

## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the qualifications of the population in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a lower proportion of people holding formal qualifications (Bachelor or higher degree; Advanced Diploma or Diploma; or Vocational qualifications), and a higher proportion of people with no formal qualifications.

Overall, 50.3% of the population aged 15 and over held educational qualifications, and 39.8% had no qualifications, compared with 53.5% and 37.5% respectively for Queensland.

The major differences between qualifications held by the population of City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons with No qualifications (39.8% compared to 37.5%)
- A larger percentage of persons with Vocational qualifications (23.9% compared to 22.1%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons with Bachelor or Higher degrees (18.1% compared to 21.9%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons with Advanced Diploma or Diplomas (8.2% compared to 9.4%)

## **Emerging groups**

The largest changes in the qualifications of the population in City of Townsville between 2016 and 2021 were in those with:

- Bachelor or Higher degrees (+4,795 persons)
- Vocational qualifications (+2,544 persons)
- Advanced Diploma or Diplomas (+1,148 persons)
- No qualifications (-617 persons)

# Highest level of schooling

City of Townsville's school completion data is a useful indicator of socio-economic status. With other indicators, such as **Proficiency in English**, the data informs planners and decision-makers about people's ability to access services. Combined with **Educational Qualifications** it also allows assessment of the skill base of the population.




#### Highest level of schooling completed, 2021

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the highest level of schooling attained by the population in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a higher proportion of people who had left school at an early level (Year 10 or less) and a lower proportion of people who completed Year 12 or equivalent.

Overall, 31.4% of the population left school at Year 10 or below, and 52.1% went on to complete Year 12 or equivalent, compared with 30.5% and 55.0% respectively for Queensland.

The major differences between the level of schooling attained by the population in City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A larger percentage of persons who completed year 10 or equivalent (22.4% compared to 21.2%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons who completed year 12 or equivalent (52.1% compared to 55.0%)

#### **Emerging groups**

The largest changes in the level of schooling attained by the population in City of Townsville, between 2016 and 2021 were:

- Year 12 or equivalent (+7,895 persons)
- Year 8 or below (-734 persons)
- Year 9 or equivalent (+599 persons)
- Year 10 or equivalent (+242 persons)

# Education institution attending

The share of City of Townsville's population attending educational institutions reflects the age structure of the population, as it is influenced by the number of children attending school; proximity to tertiary education, which can mean young adults leaving home to be nearer to educational facilities and; the degree to which people are seeking out educational opportunities in adulthood, especially in their late teens and early twenties.

This data is often combined with Age Structure to identify areas with significant university student populations.




#### Education institution attending, 2021

# Dominant groups

Analysis of the share of the population attending educational institutions in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a similar proportion attending primary school, a similar proportion attending secondary school, and a similar proportion engaged in tertiary level education.

Overall, 8.4% of the population were attending primary school, 6.9% of the population were attending secondary institutions, and 6.8% were learning at a tertiary level, compared with 8.3%, 6.8% and 6.5% respectively for Queensland.

The major differences between the share of the population attending learning institutions in City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A larger percentage of persons attending a Catholic primary school (2.7% compared to 1.5%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons not attending (67.4% compared to 69.5%)

# **Emerging groups**

From 2016 to 2021, City of Townsville's population increased by 6,022 people (+3.2%). This represents an average annual change of 0.64% per year over the period.

The largest changes in the number of persons attending education institutions in City of Townsville, between 2016 and 2021 were in those who nominated:

- University (-1,135 persons)
- Secondary school (+1,048 persons)
- Pre-school (+826 persons)
- Secondary Catholic (+733 persons)

# Need for assistance

City of Townsville's disability statistics relate directly to need for assistance due to a severe or profound disability. 

#### Need for assistance with core activities, 2021




Persons who need assistance by age group (years)

## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the need for assistance of people in the City of Townsville compared to Queensland shows that there was a similar proportion of people who reported needing assistance with core activities.

Overall, 5.9% of the population reported needing assistance with core activities, compared with 6.0% for Queensland.

The major differences in the age groups reporting a need for assistance in City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons aged 80 to 84 (30.9% compared to 27.5%)
- A larger percentage of persons aged 75 to 79 (19.8% compared to 17.2%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons aged 85 and over (51.5% compared to 49.0%)
- A larger percentage of persons aged 70 to 74 (12.8% compared to 11.7%)

# **Emerging groups**

The major differences in the age groups reporting a need for assistance between 2016 and 2021 in City of Townsville were in the age groups:

- 20 to 59 (+396 persons)
- 10 to 19 (+296 persons)
- 75 to 79 (+296 persons)
- 70 to 74 (+251 persons)

The 2021 Census looked for the first time at the level of incidence of selected long-term health conditions in the community. The Census question asked respondents if they have been diagnosed with a specific condition (or other condition) from a list of ten conditions plus "other". Combined, these ten conditions comprise approximately 60% of Australia's deaths, and even those which are not deadly contribute substantially to the burden of disease.

It is well known that socio-economic factors also contribute to morbidity and health outcomes, with lower-socio economic characteristics correlated with higher incidence of some health conditions. The inclusion of this topic in the Census enables these factors to be explored in more detail.

Also, in society, health conditions tend to increase with age. For these reasons, it is recommended that long-term health conditions data for be viewed at in conjunction with age structure, household income, educational qualifications, and need for assistance datasets, along with the SEIFA index of disadvantage.



# Dominant groups

Analysis of the long term health conditions of City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a lower proportion of people with a long-term health condition 32.6% compared to 32.9% in Queensland.

There were no major differences in the long-term health conditions between City of Townsville and Queensland in 2021.

## **Employment status**

City of Townsville's employment statistics are an important indicator of socio-economic status. The levels of full or part-time employment, unemployment and labour force participation indicate the strength of the local economy and social characteristics of the population. Employment status is linked to a number of factors including Age Structure, which influences the number of people in the workforce; the economic base and employment opportunities available in the area and; the education and skill base of the population (Occupations, Industries, Qualifications).

The two most important measures are:

- Unemployment rate the number of people looking for work, as a percentage of the labour force (employed and unemployed over 15)
- Participation rate the labour force expressed as a percentage of the total population over 15

Please note that in the 2021 Census, due to the COVID pandemic and lockdowns in many areas, the proportion of people who were employed but away from work in the week before Census has increased. We have no information on whether these people were normally employed full or part time so this is shown separately.



Total persons in the labour force



## Dominant groups

The size of City of Townsville's labour force in 2021 was 99,024, of which 28,759 were employed part-time and 59,317 were full time workers.

Analysis of the employment status (as a percentage of the labour force) in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a similar proportion in employment, as well as a similar proportion unemployed. Overall, 94.9% of the labour force was employed, and 5.1% unemployed, compared with 94.6% and 5.4% respectively for Queensland.

Analysis of the labour force participation rate of the population in City of Townsville in 2021 shows that there was a higher proportion in the labour force (63.6%) compared with Queensland (61.6%).

## **Emerging groups**

Between 2016 and 2021, the number of people employed in City of Townsville showed an increase of 7,540, and the number unemployed showed a decrease of 3,397. In the same period, the number of people in the labour force showed an increase of 4,143 or 4.4%.

# Industry sector of employment

City of Townsville's industry statistics identify the industry sectors in which the residents work (which may be within the residing area or elsewhere). This will be influenced by the skill base and socio-economic status of the residents as well as the industries and employment opportunities present in the region.



### Industry sector of employment, 2021



## **Dominant groups**

An analysis of the jobs held by the resident population in City of Townsville in 2021 shows the three most popular industry sectors were:

- Health Care and Social Assistance (16,480 people or 17.5%)
- Public Administration and Safety (11,800 people or 12.6%)
- Education and Training (8,826 people or 9.4%)

In combination, these three industries employed 37,106 people in total or 39.5% of the total employed resident population.

In comparison, Queensland employed 15.4% in Health Care and Social Assistance; 6.2% in Public Administration and Safety; and 8.8% in Education and Training.

The major differences between the jobs held by the population of City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons employed in public administration and safety (12.6% compared to 6.2%)
- A *larger* percentage of persons employed in health care and social assistance (17.5% compared to 15.4%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons employed in professional, scientific and technical services (4.5% compared to 6.7%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons employed in agriculture, forestry and fishing (0.7% compared to 2.6%)



### Occupation of employment, 2021



## Dominant groups

An analysis of the jobs held by the resident population in City of Townsville in 2021 shows the three most popular occupations were:

- Professionals (18,550 people or 19.7%)
- Community and Personal Service Workers (15,159 people or 16.1%)
- Technicians and Trades Workers (13,681 people or 14.6%)

In combination these three occupations accounted for 47,390 people in total or 50.4% of the employed resident population.

In comparison, Queensland employed 21.4% in Professionals; 12.3% in Community and Personal Service Workers; and 13.7% in Technicians and Trades Workers.

#### The major differences between the jobs held by the population of City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons employed as Community and Personal Service Workers (16.1% compared to 12.3%)
- A smaller percentage of persons employed as Managers (10.1% compared to 12.5%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons employed as Professionals (19.7% compared to 21.4%)

### Method of travel to work

City of Townsville's commuting statistics reveal the main modes of transport by which residents get to work. There are a number of reasons why people use different modes of transport to get to work including the availability of affordable and effective public transport options, the number of motor vehicles available within a household, and the distance travelled to work.

Commuting data is very useful in transport planning as it informs decision-makers about the availability, effectiveness and utilisation of local transport options, particularly when analysed with Residents Place of Work data and Car Ownership.

WARNING: Method of travel to work relates to Census day, which for the 2021 Census occurred during COVID-19 lockdowns for large parts of Australia. In lockdown, many occupations were required to work from home if possible, and some industries were closed, so people did not go to work. For this reason, these categories may have increased, with corresponding declines in other methods of travel. Use the data with caution when comparing over time. 

## Method of travel to work, 2021


Total employed persons

## Dominant groups

In 2021, there were 1,123 people who caught public transport to work (train, bus, tram or ferry) in City of Townsville, compared with 72,908 who drove in private vehicles (car – as driver, car – as passenger, motorbike, or truck).

Analysis of the method of travel to work of the residents in City of Townsville in 2021, compared to Queensland, shows that 1.2% used public transport, while 76.0% used a private vehicle, compared with 4.0% and 64.0% respectively in Queensland.

The major differences in persons between the method of travel to work of City of Townsville and Queensland were:

- A *larger* percentage of persons who travelled by car (as driver) (70.6% compared to 59.5%)
- A *smaller* percentage of persons who worked at home (5.1% compared to 14.1%)
- A smaller percentage of persons who travelled by train (0.0% compared to 1.8%)

# **Emerging groups**

The number of employed people in City of Townsville increased by 7,534 between 2016 and 2021.

The largest changes in the method of travel to work by resident population in City of Townsville between 2016 and 2021 were for those nominated:

- Car as driver (+4,905 persons)
- Worked at home (+2,414 persons)
- Did not go to work (+1,347 persons)
- Bicycle (-377 persons)

### Volunteer work

The voluntary work sector is an important part of Australia's economy. The level of volunteering can indicate the cohesiveness of the community and how readily individuals are able to contribute to that community. Factors impacting on the level of volunteering in City of Townsville include the Age Structure of the population, the level of Proficiency in English, Income and Education levels.

Volunteer numbers for the 2021 Census declined in many parts of Australia due to lockdowns and COVID-19 distancing measures.



### Volunteer work, 2021


Total persons

## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the voluntary work performed by the population in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a lower proportion of people who volunteered for an organisation or group.

Overall, 13.3% of the population reported performing voluntary work, compared with 14.1% for Queensland.

The number of volunteers in City of Townsville decreased by 6,697 people between 2016 and 2021.

### Household income

Households form the common 'economic unit' in our society. City of Townsville's Household Income is one of the most important indicators of socio-economic status. With other data sources, such as Qualifications and Occupation, it helps to reveal the economic opportunities and socio-economic status of City of Townsville. It is important to note that income data is not necessarily a measure of wealth. For example, if an area has a large number of retirees this will produce a higher proportion of households with low income but the retirees may have large capital wealth. For this reason, household income should be viewed in conjunction with Age and Household Composition.



## Dominant groups

Analysis of household income levels in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a smaller proportion of high income households (those earning \$3,000 per week or more) and a lower proportion of low income households (those earning less than \$800 per week).

Overall, 18.4% of the households earned a high income and 19.9% were low income households, compared with 20.1% and 21.4% respectively for Queensland.

The major difference between the household incomes of City of Townsville and Queensland is:

• A larger percentage of households who earned Not stated (9.0% compared to 7.8%)

# Household type

City of Townsville's household and family structure is one of the most important demographic indicators. It reveals the area's residential role and function, era of settlement and provides key insights into the level of demand for services and facilities as most are related to age and household types.




### Household type, 2021

## Dominant groups

Analysis of the household/family types in City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a lower proportion of couple families with child(ren) as well as a higher proportion of one-parent families. Overall, 26.0% of total families were couple families with child(ren), and 11.9% were one-parent families, compared with 27.9% and 11.1% respectively for Queensland.

There were a higher proportion of lone person households and a lower proportion of couples without children. Overall, the proportion of lone person households was 24.2% compared to 23.1% in Queensland while the proportion of couples without children was 25.4% compared to 26.4% in Queensland.

### **Emerging groups**

The number of households in City of Townsville increased by 3,968 between 2016 and 2021.

The largest changes in family/household types in City of Townsville between 2016 and 2021 were:

- Lone person (+2,556 households)
- Couples without children (+1,314 households)

# Dwelling type

Dwelling Type is an important determinant of City of Townsville's residential role and function. A greater concentration of higher density dwellings is likely to attract more young adults and smaller households, often renting. Larger, detached or separate dwellings are more likely to attract families and prospective families. The residential built form often reflects market opportunities or planning policy, such as building denser forms of housing around public transport nodes or employment centres.

Dwelling Type statistics should be viewed in conjunction with Household Size, Household Types, Housing Tenure and Age Structure for a more complete picture of the housing market in City of Townsville.




### Dwelling structure, 2021

## Dominant groups

In 2021, there were 64,927 separate houses in the area, 12,372 medium density dwellings, and 4,362 high density dwellings. In addition, there were 1,070 caravans/cabins/houseboats in the area.

Analysis of the types of dwellings in City of Townsville in 2021 shows that 78.0% of all dwellings were separate houses; 14.9% were medium density dwellings, and 5.2% were in high density dwellings, compared with 71.9%, 16.2%, and 9.7% in the Queensland respectively.

In 2021, a total of 90.2% of the dwellings in City of Townsville were occupied on Census night, compared to 91.0% in Queensland. The proportion of unoccupied dwellings was 9.6%, which is larger compared to that found in Queensland (8.8%).

## **Emerging groups**

The total number of dwellings in City of Townsville increased by 3,257 between 2016 and 2021.

The largest changes in the type of dwellings found in City of Townsville between 2016 and 2021 were:

- Separate house (+3,030 dwellings)
- Medium density (+387 dwellings)
- Caravans, cabin, houseboat (-326 dwellings)
- High density (+174 dwellings)

## Housing tenure

City of Townsville's Housing Tenure data provides insights into its socio-economic status as well as the role it plays in the housing market. For example, a high concentration of private renters may indicate a transient area attractive to young singles and couples, while a concentration of home owners indicates a more settled area with mature families and empty-nesters (Household Summary). Tenure can also reflect built form (Dwelling Type), with a significantly higher share of renters in high density housing and a substantially larger proportion of homeowners in separate houses, although this is not always the case.

In conjunction with other socio-economic status indicators in City of Townsville, Tenure data is useful for analysing housing markets, housing affordability and identifying public housing areas.




### Housing tenure, 2021

## **Dominant groups**

Analysis of the housing tenure of households of City of Townsville in 2021 compared to Queensland shows that there was a smaller proportion of households who owned their dwelling; a larger proportion purchasing their dwelling; and a larger proportion who were renters.

Overall, 24.0% of households owned their dwelling; 33.4% were purchasing, and 34.8% were renting, compared with 28.2%, 32.4% and 31.7% respectively for Queensland.

The largest changes in housing tenure categories for the households in City of Townsville between 2016 and 2021 were:

- Fully owned (+2,296 households)
- Mortgage (+1,898 households)

The total number of households in City of Townsville increased by 3,961 between 2016 and 2021.

# SEIFA by Local Government Area

The City of Townsville Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SEIFA) measure the relative level of socio-economic disadvantage and/or advantage based on a range of Census characteristics. Two of the SEIFA indexes: the Index of Relative Socio-Economic Disadvantage (IRSD) and the Index of Relative Socio-Economic Advantage and Disadvantage (IRSAD) can be selected below.

### Index of Relative Socio-Economic Disadvantage (IRSD)

This index contains only disadvantage indicators (e.g. unemployment, low incomes or education levels, single parent families, low skilled occupations, poor English proficiency), so is best used to distinguish between disadvantaged areas, but doesn't differentiate between those areas which are highly advantaged, and those just lacking a lot of disadvantage (with population close to the middle). This index is most commonly used for funding allocations and advocacy, because it highlights the areas of most need.

### Index of Relative Socio-Economic Advantage and Disadvantage (IRSAD)

This index contains indicators of disadvantage as well as additional indicators of advantage (e.g. professional occupations, high income, higher education levels, high rent, large dwellings), Characteristics are also weighted differently than the IRSD, so areas do score differently on either measure. Often the IRSAD index will show a more "spread out" distribution with a greater range of scores from very high to very low, due to its ability to measure advantage above the average level.

SEIFA indexes are a good place to start to get a general view of the relative level of disadvantage in one area compared to others, but it is important to also look at these underlying characteristics as they can differ markedly between areas with similar SEIFA scores and shed light on the type of disadvantage being experienced.

A higher score on the index means a *lower* level of disadvantage or (in the case of IRSAD only) a *higher* level of advantage. A lower score on the index means a *higher* level of disadvantage on both indexes, and a lack of advantage on the IRSAD.

The percentile column indicates the approximate position of this small area in a ranked list of Australia's suburbs and localities in 2021. It's meant to give a broad indication of where the area sits within the whole nation. A higher number indicates a higher socio-economic status. For instance, a percentile of 72 indicates that approximately 72% of Australia's suburbs have a SEIFA index lower than this area (more disadvantaged), while 28% are higher. This applies a comparison to suburbs even when the index concerned doesn't relate to a suburb.
