<p>Tell us how your initiative will support the identified grant priority?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reference the priority you have identified • Is there any evidence and/or research to support your initiative? • How you will measure the impact of your initiative? – specifically in relation to the identified priority • How will what you are proposing to do meet the priority you have chosen?
<p>How your initiative will benefit the community?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What are the needs of your target audience or community? • Will your initiative enable this need to be met? • Are there any benefits to the wider community beyond the target audience? • Provide clear evidence or examples to support your initiative – how will it benefit? Have you seen other similar initiatives? • Have your target audience identified this initiative as something they want? • Provide indications of how you will measure the benefits of your initiative – how will you know that it was successful?
<p>How will you work with the community and other organisations in the development and delivery of this initiative?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe the engagement and collaboration that has been undertaken, or that is planned, in the development and/or delivery of your initiative • Who are your stakeholders/partners and what do they bring to the initiative? • What benefits to the initiative are there by working in partnership?

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What are the community benefits to working in partnership? • How have you, or are planning on, engaging them?
<p>Tell us how your organisation has the capacity to deliver this initiative?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What is the capacity of your organisation to deliver your initiative? • Staffing/Volunteer requirements? • How will you meet these? • What is your track record with these types of initiatives? • What other, similar, initiatives have you successfully delivered and acquitted? • What learnings or skills did these provide? • What are the skills within your organisation, or that you are sourcing, that will allow you to deliver this initiative successfully?
<p>Tell us how the benefits gained from this initiative will be sustained?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How will the benefits described be sustained beyond the initiative? • What will the long-lasting impacts of this initiative be? • How will you measure this impact or benefits? • What are the plans for future funding, resourcing, or partnerships to enable the benefits to be sustained? • What evidence or examples can you provide in support of your responses?
