

APJOHN STREET DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS

PROJECT UPDATE: FEBRUARY 2021

OVERVIEW

Townsville City Council has received funding under the Commonwealth and Queensland Government's *Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangement* (DRFA) to help our community recover from the impact of recent natural disasters.

The Apjohn Street Drainage Improvement project is partially funded under this arrangement.

As part of this project, Council intends to improve the stormwater drainage flow at Horseshoe Bay Park and along Apjohn Street.

STAGING OF WORKS

The works will be undertaken in stages as illustrated on the accompanying consultation graphic and will require the need to:

- remove existing garden beds on the northern side of Apjohn Street to accommodate the power supply required for the relocation of ergonomics power poles
- relocate the existing Horseshoe Bay Park multi-purpose sports court
- construct an open drain through Horseshoe Bay Park and install associated fencing
- install a drainage culvert at the intersection of Horseshoe Bay Road and Apjohn Street
- install a guard rail along the identified section of Apjohn Street
- excavate and reconstruct a portion of Apjohn Street identified for drainage works.
