
# CHECK YOUR PROPERTY FOR YELLOW CRAZY ANTS

## DISTINGUISHING YELLOW CRAZY ANTS FROM SIMILAR SPECIES

#### Yellow Crazy Ant

Anoplolepis Gracilipes:

- Very long legs and antennae
- Frantic movement when disturbed
- Slender golden body, brown abdomen
- Sprays acid, doesn't bite

#### **Meat Ant**

*Iridomyrmex spp.*: Shorter antennae and legs

- Large square head
- Bites but does not spray acid

#### Funnel Ant

Aphaenogaster spp.:

- Shorter legs and antennae
- Brown solid, stocky body

#### Strobe Ant

Opisthopsis spp.:

- Shorter legs and antennae
- Large abdomen, head and eyes
- Moves in a stop-start (strobe) motion

#### **Green Tree Ant**

Oecophylla smaragdina:

- Long legs and antennae
- Green abdomen and head
- Sprays acid and also bites



#### Carpenter Ant

Camponotus spp.:

- Short legs and antennae
- Large stocky body, often golden or brown
