Item 1. Submissions Action Register

Update - Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)

ICAC is one of the monitoring groups of the RAP. The current plan runs until November 2017, so is approaching an evaluation point. The writing of a new plan will occur in early 2018. Currently the plan is at Innovate level – will be trying to reach Stretch level.

Update - Changing Lives Changing Community (NDIS in Townsville) Action Group This workshop was held in May 2017 to help support the community through the transition to the NDIS in Townsville. There were a number of action groups formed from the workshop:

- Awareness/Inclusiveness Training
- Work Connectable
- 'The Journey'
- Silver Level Housing
- Information Hub

Update - Advisory Committees

Councillor R Cook provided an update on the other advisory Committees:

- ACAC have begun their action plan have priority areas set and some actions established.
- CSAC have begun their action plan.
 - Have formed a partnership with Crime Stoppers and have erected signage in key areas
 - Cutting back vegetation along Ross River using workers on probation or parole
 - Working with QPS to ensure abandoned vehicles are left in a safe position and removed within a reasonable timeframe.

Item 2. Introduction - Eber Butron, Director Planning and Community Engagement

Eber Butron introduced himself and spoke about his current portfolio with Townsville City Council, and his previous roles.

Item 3. White Ribbon

Stephanie Paduano and Stephanie Callanan from White Ribbon provided the following information:

- White Ribbon staff were invited to attend the meeting and provided an overview of White Ribbon and their programs, including the workplace accreditation program.
- Provided an overview of the workplace accreditation program, which aims to enhance an organisation's ability to respond to and prevent violence against women.
- 8 local councils are currently accredited across NSW and Victoria White Ribbon is working with five more across the two states plus South Australia.
- It is a rigorous program and other organisations have employed staff to specifically focus on its implementation.
- Questions / Comments:
 - Issue with police not giving weight to women in domestic violence situations what work is White Ribbon doing with police to address this?
 - The core focus of White Ribbon is broad community engagement but it is agreed that that structural change is needed. White Ribbon have worked with some police bodies to achieve White Ribbon accreditation, but the main focus is on advocacy at high level and currently White Ribbon do not lobby for structural change.
 - Asked for confirmation that the purpose of this presentation is for ICAC to recommend that council seeks White Ribbon accreditation.
 - Correct. The process to achieve accreditation is 18 months if at the end
 of the program there are still deliverables to be met, an extension is
 available. Accreditation then lasts for 3 years this is a maintenance
 phase over which access to White Ribbon resources is still available.
 - Risk management concern raised if the public are aware that council is White Ribbon accredited, and a council member / employee is involved in a domestic violence issue, how would that be managed?
 - Messaging from a PR perspective is that the organisation is working towards creating change.
 - Council also already has processes in place to deal with unacceptable behavior.
 - O What is the cost of the program?
 - \$25,000 covers both the 18 month implementation program and 3 years accreditation.
 - Is White Ribbon going to broaden focus from men's violence against women, to include other forms of violence?
 - White Ribbon encourages inclusivity if an organisation wants to incorporate other elements in their program and enhance their messaging, White Ribbon will support that and there are other partners available to work with.

The Acting Chair requested support from the Committee to progress the process for Council's White Ribbon Accreditation. The majority of Committee members indicated their support.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL'S CONSIDERATION:

That Council consider progressing with a White Ribbon workplace accreditation.

Item 4. Townsville City Bus Hub

Rob Kent, Senior Project Manager, Townsville City Council provided the following information on the Townsville City Bus Hub and current projects:

- Major Projects current projects:
 - o Cleveland Bay purification upgrade
 - CBD works upgrading water infrastructure
 - NQ Stadium
 - o Bus Hub
- Current bus stops in the city will be consolidated in a single location at the Bus Hub, which will be located in Ogden Street. This should encourage reactivation of the CBD and provide pedestrian access to the new stadium, waterfront promenade and other cultural projects.
- Funding has been committed by the state government, with council delivering infrastructure on government's behalf.
- Concept design has been developed and a detailed design is out for tender.
- Questions / Comments:
 - Regarding accessibility of bus hub to other key areas will there be continuous paths of travel from the bus hub to areas like Palmer Street or the new Stadium?
 - The work will be DDA compliant but council has not considered connectivity to Palmer Street or access through Metway Arcade (which is not DDA compliant as it is too steep). Accessible thoroughfares to Flinders Street are planned to be via Stokes Street and Stanley Street.
 - Cover provided by shelters questioned it is suggested that they should extend slightly over the road to provide better coverage from weather.
 - Major Projects will consider this suggestion but it would be a question of budget.
 - Artwork:
 - ACAC has been approached regarding potential artwork for the space.
 - Taxis:
 - There will be provision for taxis to use the area as well.
 - o Bathrooms:
 - No new public restrooms are planned for space –The current ones at Bulletin Square will be available
 - o Security:
 - No consultation as yet with police regarding security of the area, but it will be part of the process. There will be CCTV installed.
 - Use by local vs. other services:
 - The Bus Hub will be used only by the local bus services.
 - Dates:
 - Construction is to commence in early 2018, with completion scheduled for mid 2018.

Committee Action:
