

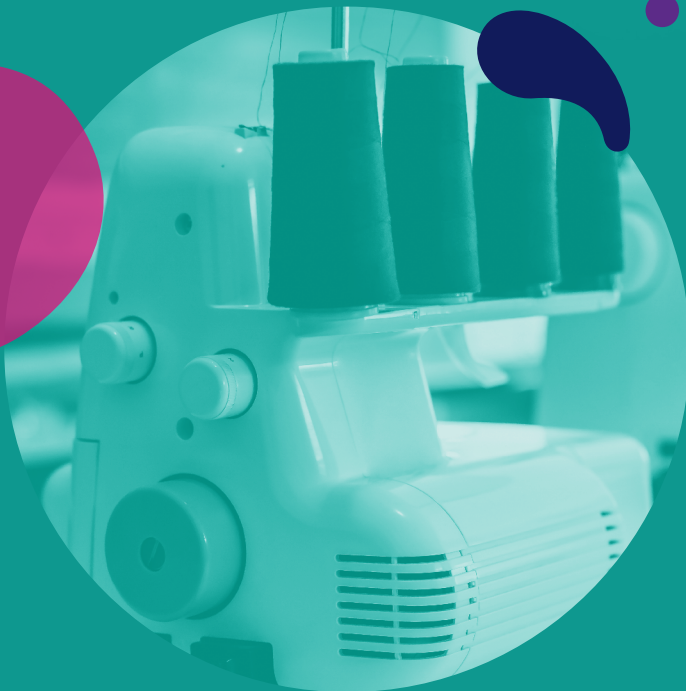

Improving outcomes for the Townsville community, encouraging informed and empowered citizens through provision of resources that enable personal and professional growth.

Equity and Inclusion

Provide library spaces that are accessible, diverse and welcoming for all, with a focus on the culturally diverse, vulnerable and at-risk.

Strategies

- 1.1 Curate inclusive collections.
- 1.2 Enhance access to lending through alternative service models.
- 1.3 Foster creativity, experimentation and innovation through programs, festivals, storytelling, STEM-focused initiatives and Makerspaces.

Goals

- 1.1.1 Conduct regular audits to align physical library collections with community needs, focusing on diverse, non-tech resources supporting creativity and research.
- 1.2.1 Mobile Library service delivery enhancement.
- 1.2.2 Develop Library Membership campaign.
- 1.3.1 Host biennial innovation festivals showcasing authors, literacy, emerging trends, technologies to engage the community including Festival of Stories and One Title One Townsville.
- 1.3.2 Deliver biennial STEM Faire expos to showcase creative projects and foster collaboration amongst learners and partners.
- 1.3.3 Enhance Makerspace with advanced tools such as 3D printers, robotic kits, coding platforms.
- 1.3.4 Collaborate with schools, community groups and industry to deliver STEM and digital innovation programs.
- 1.3.5 Invest in emerging technologies to prepare for future learning trends eg VR, AI and Internet of Things tools.

Strengthen community bonds through provision of inclusive spaces and programs that encourage collaboration and social interaction.

Goals

- 2.1.1 Transform existing branches into dynamic community hubs focusing on inclusivity and accessibility.
- 2.1.2 Integrate adaptive technologies to ensure inclusive access for individuals with diverse abilities.
- 2.2.1 Launch targeted programs for social isolation, cultural celebration, mental health, financial literacy and workforce readiness.
- 2.3.1 Expand outreach services across underserved areas.
- 2.3.2 Explore opportunities for provision of dementia programs.
- 2.4.1 Partner with schools for early literacy and STEM programs that inspire innovation.
- 2.4.2 Collaborate with business to offer job training opportunities and study placements.

Foster a lifelong learning community through accessible programs, resources and initiatives.

Strategies

- 3.1 Enhance literacy and lifelong learning initiatives for all ages, with a focus on digital literacy, financial literacy and First 5 Forever.
- 3.2 Strengthen partnerships for enriched learning.
- 3.3 Work towards bridging the digital divide.
- 3.4 Promote cultural awareness.
- 3.5 Support inclusive and peer learning.

Goals

- 3.1.1 Develop a regional digital literacy campaign targeting all age groups supported by future-focused digital literacy workshops.
- 3.1.2 Expand Deadly Digital Inclusion programs to support digital literacy skills for First Nations.
- 3.1.3 Expand the library's digital collections and online platforms to reach users where they are.
- 3.2.1 Build and sustain strong collaborations with education institutions, local business and Smart Precinct NQ to amplify impact and reach.
- 3.3.1 Pilot a Digital Skills Accelerator Program for emerging technologies such as coding, AI and VR.
- 3.3.2 Offer digital literacy workshops for all ages covering topics from basic IT skills to advanced coding and AI.
- 3.4.1 Collaborate with First Nations leaders to develop programs and workshops celebrating First Nations heritage and traditions.
- 3.5.1 Establish a learning hub within the library for local educators, students and community groups to collaborate.

Belong

Create welcoming spaces that foster a sense of identity, inclusion and pride for all of the community.

Strategies

- 4.1 Enhance library infrastructure through innovative approaches.
- 4.2 Enhance and upgrade library facilities.
- 4.3 Prioritise accessibility and universal design.
- 4.4 Showcase Local History and identity.

Goals

- 4.1.1 Plan for new library branches in high-growth areas.
- 4.1.2 Explore alternative service models, such as 24/7 Lending Kiosks, for provision of library services across the region.
- 4.2.1 Conduct regular facility assessments to maintain welcoming and inclusive spaces, refreshing furnishings as required.
- 4.2.2 Improve asset management for library facilities.
- 4.3.1 Review design and layout of existing spaces to priorities inclusivity, accessibility and sustainability.
- 4.3.2 Design flexible spaces to accommodate diverse community programs and gatherings.
- 4.3.3 Develop a Furniture Replacement Plan with a focus on environmentally sustainable furniture and fittings.
- 4.4.1 Develop flagship programs and initiatives to showcase and celebrate Townsville's cultural heritage.

Encourage sustainable practices and leverage technology in the delivery of programs to support education at all levels, from early literacy to advanced research.

Cultural and Historical Respect

Celebrate First Nations cultures, promote the unique cultural heritage of the Townsville region, including Indigenous histories and Torres Strait Islander contributions, and champion intellectual freedom.

Strive for value through streamlined and integrated service delivery, seeking to continually improve and drive community outcomes and ensure high standards of customer service delivery to meet community needs.
