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## 1.0 Introduction

AECOM Australia Pty Ltd (AECOM) have been engaged by Townsville City Council (Council) to prepare the third Annual Compliance Report for the Ross River Dam (RRD) to Douglas Water Treatment Plant (DWTP) Pipeline Duplication Project (the Project). The Project is located approximately 12 kilometres (km) south-west of the Townsville Central Business District (CBD), within Townsville City Council in North Queensland.

Approval under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) for the Project (EPBC 2021/9002) was obtained on 2 June 2022 for the approved action, i.e.:

*‘To construct a 9.5 km subterranean water pipeline from the Ross River Dam to the Douglas Water Treatment Plant, 12 km southwest of the Townsville Central Business District.’*

### 1.1 Purpose of Report

This compliance report has been prepared to satisfy the requirements of Condition 13 of EPBC Approval 2021/9002 and has been prepared in line with the *‘Annual Compliance Report Guidelines, Reporting under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999’* (Department of Climate Change Energy the Environment and Water, 2023).

The date of commencement of the action was 11 July 2022, therefore this report provides an assessment of compliance against each of the conditions between the period of 11 July 2024 to 10 July 2025.

The key dates that relate to EPBC Approval 2021/9002 are detailed in Table 1 below.

This report will be published on the Council website and provided to the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEE) as required by Condition 13.

## 2.0 Description of Activities

### 2.1 Project Overview

The existing RRD to DWTP pipeline is approximately 9.5 km long. It is understood the existing pipe, built in 1975, is a bespoke construction comprising an inner reinforced concrete pipe (RCP) that is wrapped in pre-stressed steel wire bands and encased in a grout shell.

Given most of Townsville's raw water supply was via this pipeline, Council recognised that the pipeline's deteriorated condition puts Townsville's water security at significant risk. It was critical that an alternative pipeline was designed and constructed to secure Townsville's water supply now and in the future.

To address this issue, Council constructed a new DN1200 (1290-millimetre (mm) outside diameter) pipe from RRD to DWTP. The pipeline starts at RRD on the western side of Ross River and crosses to the east approximately 600 m downstream of the dam spillway where it continues to DWTP, predominantly within Defence's Mt Stuart Training Area (MSTA).

Following the approval of EPBC 2021/9002, additional stockpile areas were identified as necessary to facilitate construction of the Project. The proposed areas were identified in consultation with Department of Defence, Council and the Construction Contractor to provide laydown and stockpiling of construction materials.

It is understood that the proposed areas were not considered to change the level of impact to the controlling provisions of the EPBC approval but did represent an administrative change, as the areas would fall outside of the approved Project footprint. The proponent communicated with DCCEEW to seek a variation to the approved action on 19 October 2022 to formalise this footprint change within the approval.

In late March 2023, DCCEEW confirmed that a variation to the original action would not be considered and that potential impacts to Matters of National Environmental Significance (MNES) associated with the additional stockpile areas would need to be considered separately. An MNES due diligence assessment was completed, which determined that a potential significant impact on MNES species as a result of clearing the additional stockpile areas was considered unlikely. The additional stockpile locations were therefore considered a separate action to this Project and not considered as part of this compliance report assessment.

Further to these stockpile areas, additional areas outside of the approved footprint were found to have been affected by ground disturbance activities. This resulted in two non-compliances in the previous reporting period in relation to Condition Part A-1 and Condition Part A-2 (refer to Table 2). Condition 3(a) of EPBC 2021/9002 variation was added in response to the non-compliances and was considered within the second reporting period. No further clearing has been undertaken this reporting period.

### 2.2 Activities During the Report Period

Project activities that occurred during the reporting period (11 July 2024 to 10 July 2025) are detailed below.

- Rehabilitation and revegetation work completed (90%)
- Weed management (85%)
- Rehabilitation monitoring – ongoing.

3.0 Compliance Assessment

An assessment of compliance against EPBC Act Approval (EPBC 2021/9002) for the reporting period between 11 July 2024 to 10 July 2025, is provided in Table 2 below. In accordance with the 'Annual Compliance Report Guidelines, Commonwealth of Australia 2023', the compliance assessment presents a compliance status finding against each condition as 'compliant', 'non-compliant' or 'not applicable'. Comments are provided against conditions where required.

## 4.0 New Environmental Risks

No new environmental risks have been identified within the current reporting period (11 July 2024 to 10 July 2025) for the Project. Project environmental risks are managed through Council's Integrated Environmental Management System Framework and the Project's Construction Environmental Management Plan (CEMP).

## 5.0 Summary

This compliance report has been prepared to satisfy the requirements of Condition 13 of EPBC Approval (EPBC 2021/9002) and has been prepared in line with the '*Annual Compliance Report Guidelines, Commonwealth of Australia 2023*' for the reporting period between 11 July 2024 and 10 July 2025.

Two non-compliances were identified within the first reporting period (2023) in relation to Condition Part A-1 and Condition Part A-2 (refer to Table 2). Further to this, during the second reporting period (2024) another approx.0.03 ha of clearing outside of the approved extent was identified (by examining aerial footage) and was found to have occurred at the same time as the previously stated non-compliance event. However, as the change was minor and within the expected margin of error for the Investigation Report of 2023, it was not deemed to warrant further separate reporting.

Notwithstanding the existing non-compliance of 2023, the current compliance review has concluded that no additional clearing of Black-throated Finch habitat occurred within this reporting period (11 July 2024 and 10 July 2025). Consequently, the Project is deemed compliant with all conditions of approval for the current compliance assessment period.

Rehabilitation works began during the previous reporting period and approximately 90% of rehabilitation works have been completed, based upon progress advice provided by council.
