

2018/19 HIGHLIGHTS

OPERATIONAL SERVICES



2018/19 HIGHLIGHTS

- Maintain 1,796km of roads and 541km of footpaths
- Maintain 343 public spaces and 4 botanic gardens
- Free two-hour parking throughout the CBD for the month of December
- Introduction of free 15-minute parking in 2P parking spaces in the CBD
- Council limited rates growth at 1.9%
- Kerbside hard waste collection
- Free dumping of green waste and recyclable materials at landfill sites
- Free tipping weekends.

MONSOON RECOVERY



2018/19 HIGHLIGHTS

- Free waste disposal for flood impacted residents
- Additional waste disposal and transfer stations
- Kerbside collection of flood waste
- Murray Sporting Complex 2,600 deliveries of waste
- Lou Litster Park 13,000 deliveries (7,000 domestic)
- Metal, including whitegoods, recovered for recycling
- Over 1,000kg of hazardous waste was collected, separated and sent for specialist treatment
- Extended payment deadlines for all ratepayers
- Three-month rates extension for monsoon affected ratepayers directly affected by the monsoon event
- 25% off volumetric water charges incurred during the monsoon billing period for ratepayers directly affected by the monsoon event.
