Townsville City Council's 2020/21 Budget will invest \$221.9 million into capital works to support local jobs and upgrade and enhance vital community assets. Council's capital investment is expected to support more than 1,769 jobs, at a time when our community needs it.

Parks and Open Spaces

Winston and Willow Garden Parks will receive new park benches. Andy Jensen Park, Arnhem Park and Mornington Park in Thuringowa Central will all receive irrigation renewals. Stage 1 of the Mount Louisa walking tracks will be finalised.



Roadworks

Funding has been allocated to improve community safety on Alder Close and Gibson Court, in Thuringowa Central (overlay). Road construction will be undertaken at Spruce Street, Kirwan.*



Pathway

A shared pathway will be constructed from Hudson Street to Kiltyhawk Crescent, Kirwan.



Bus Stops

Bus stop upgrades will take place in Kirwan, on Bamford Lane, Ridley Road, Sonata Place, Marchwood Avenue and Scarisbrick Drive.

\$7.6m Natural Environmental Recovery and Resilience Works

Restoration of Townsuille's waterways and damaged coastal environment.



\$5.6m Pensioner Concessions

One of the most generous pensioner rate concessions in Queensland with up to \$800 p.a. available to eligible pensioners.



50% Discount Sewerage Charges

For not-for-profit sporting and recreational organisations, in addition to \$1.5m of concessions already provided.
